- .01 <u>4th and 5th Grade Teachers</u> Dr. Sonya Joyner introduced the 4th and 5th grade teachers to the Board: Mrs. Houk, 5/6 combo (has been at PTC 8 years); Ms. Guyton, 5th grade (second year at PTC). Her class scored the highest scores on the Higher Balance Test; and Ms. Marin (first year teacher, first year at PTC). A PowerPoint *Welcome to the 4th and 5th Grades* was shown that explained activities of the 4th and 5th grade classes:
 - <u>Science Fun</u> Program called Mystery Science which has video inquiry lessons is used. Cumulating activity on science and motion will be done at Knott Berry Farm.
 - <u>Math Meets Music</u> Music is incorporated in math. Video was shown how the students sing the multiplication tables. The teacher writes lyrics and students choose tune.
 - <u>Dance Class</u> Once a week (3:30 5:00). Kindergartens 3rd dance folklores; 4th and 5th grades dance hip hop and jazz.
 - The Cheerleaders placed in the parade. Wonderful parents donated logos and had them put on all the cheerleaders' uniform tops.
 - ILit is used in all classes. Language Arts encompasses everything. Students love the Program and apply what they have learned in every area.
 - Enrichment available for students who are on and/or above grade level.
 - Growth rate since inception of ILit is 1.5 to 3 points.
- .02 <u>Department of Special Services</u> Mrs. Sylvia Ellison, Education Specialist, reported enrollment as of today is 335. Currently twenty-nine students with IEPs and three with 504 Plans are being served. Eight of the twenty-nine students are served in the Special Day Class setting, sixteen are served with RSP support and inclusion, five are receiving small group support (speech and language) and are in the full inclusion setting. The first ELAC meeting is scheduled for October 28. The topics of discussion will include the recent changes

affecting the California English Language Test, perfect attendance, self-esteem and antibullying.
